

The 10-week program will be held at the Children's Dental Health Association at 1270 24th Street in San Diego. It is open to current SDCDS member staff and individuals looking to enter the dental field. Participants will gain essential skills and hands-on experience to prepare for a successful career in dental assisting.

One of the standout benefits of this program is its exclusive discounts for SDCDS staff members. SDCDS RELAUNCHES THE Mentorship + Leadership PROGRAM

AFTER A SEVERAL-YEAR HIATUS, we are excited to announce that SDCDS has relaunched our much-loved mentorship program! On February 5th, 20 mentors and mentees met at Ignite to kick off the mentorship program with a mentor-mentee mixer. Our mentors and mentees participated in professional speed-dating as a way for all mentors and mentees to meet each other before being paired.

With the program's relaunch, we made some changes to enhance the success and continuity of the mentorship program. Participants will answer an in-depth questionnaire before being matched with their mentor/mentee, which will help participants center their priorities and expectations before starting the program. They will also complete a personality assessment before participation to enhance mentors' and mentees' compatibility. All participants will be given a leadership style questionnaire to help develop their leadership skills, which will help both mentors and mentees.

Our participants' breadth of practice experiences runs the gamut of dental careers. Some of our mentors include "seasoned" dentists who have just retired or are nearing retirement, while others are at the peak of their clinical careers. Some work for the military, while others are/were private practice owners their whole careers. Our mentees include some who have just graduated from dental school or residency in the last year, while others have been practicing for several years. And, like the mentors, we had some mentees who are currently working in the military.

Mentors and mentees will meet quarterly, during which they will be given assignments to complete together to enhance their practice skills and leadership abilities. A mid-year mixer will take place as well.

Let Me Introduce...

Please meet Dr. Rosa Le

Let Me Introduce is an ongoing column featured in *Facets* to introduce us to the many members that make up the depth and breadth of the San Diego County Dental Society. We hope you enjoy getting to know your colleagues better.

I was first introduced to Dr. Le (pronounced “Lay”) during an editorial board meeting for *Facets*. I had the absolute pleasure of interviewing her and found that we share some striking similarities in our upbringing as well as how we got hooked on dentistry. I learned that while she is passionate about service and impacting the oral health of her patients, Dr. Le has a heart for the people and is deeply motivated to educate them on the importance of their overall systemic health. This was one of the most down-to-earth interviews I have conducted and we laughed a lot. I hope you enjoy learning about her as much as I have.



So, tell us a little about yourself. Where are you from originally? Where did you grow up?

“I am originally from San Jose, CA and grew up in the suburb Milpitas.”

Are you from a big, medium-sized, or small family?

“My immediate family is just my mom and myself, but she has a ton of siblings and they have a ton of kids, as well. I have 25 first cousins, all on my mom’s side, and some of them have children, and some of those children have children too! There was a 20-year age difference from my mom and her oldest sister, so the generations are spread out.”

I recently did our family tree and it spans 3’ by 1’ in tiny handwriting! I was the baby cousin! A lot of people can’t tell I am an only child, because I grew up with my cousins as my siblings!”

What was one of your favorite childhood memories or activities?

“I had a lot of fun with my extended family. We would actually play outside! I remember playing outside until the sun went down. We’d make up random games, ride bikes, have picnics, play tag. We had so much fun we lost track of time, and an adult would have to yell at us to come in and eat. Do kids do that anymore? Haha! During winter breaks, two of my cousins and I would stay up ALL NIGHT, and play Monopoly, Mario Party and Mario Kart.”

Where did you complete your undergraduate studies? What did you major in?

“I went to UCSD (Go Tritons!) and was a double major in Biochemistry and Psychology. I graduated in 2012. I was a clinic manager in the Pre-Dental Society and a volunteer with Habitat For Humanity.”

What was your “aha” moment in becoming a dentist? How did you choose this fine profession?

“I was unsure but knew I wanted to be some sort of doctor. I volunteered a lot during high school. I also started shadowing people. I shadowed a pharmacist and that was no fun.... sorry pharmacist friends! I heard UCSD had an intense pre-dental society, and that turned out to be true. There was a moment when we were volunteering at the UCSD Free Dental Clinic and a woman came in to get

crowns delivered. It was my first day and they didn’t tell me she was getting #8 and #9 delivered. I was outside doing her intake and she was covering her mouth when she spoke. Then she went into the clinic and received her treatment. The next thing I heard was her choked up cry, the kind where you squeak, and she was just sobbing. I ran over because I thought we were having an emergency situation, but as it turned out, she was elated and happy that she could smile again! I started to cry and tried to push my tears back, since I was still on the clock! It was serendipitous on my first day. I think Dr. Irv Silverstein set this up! After my observations, I knew I wanted to be a part of making people feel like this.”

Where did you attend dental school? What year did you graduate?

“The University of Maryland, Baltimore. I graduated in 2017. I applied all over the country. I ended up going to an interview in Baltimore, and at the end of the interview one of the professors called me by name in front of all the other interviewees, to come to her office. She told me that Dr. Silverstein had spoken to her, as well as another professor, and they really wanted me there. I felt like I belonged there! I loved my time there. Afterward, I did a GPR at Denver Health Medical Center and finished in 2018.”

What do you love most about dentistry?

“I think I have to circle back to that feeling of making someone feel special. I am making a person feel special, one at a time. Specifically, it was being able to spend time educating Black men about their health. Many of them would have other comorbidities, like high blood pressure or diabetes, but had not had any medical professional explain the conditions, and I would have to explain to them why I couldn’t give them anesthetic with epinephrine. I would talk to them about their health and ask questions about why they weren’t taking their medication. Their responses were almost always, ‘because I feel fine!’ I would sit with them and give them a biology lesson to help them understand why their medication was so important. There are a lot of doctors that come from different or higher socio-economic backgrounds than their patients, and I think they don’t understand the gap of health literacy and the need to actually spend time with their patients. I had a lot of conversations to educate patients. It hits home for me, especially since I had to be my mom’s translator at the age of 7.”

Where do you practice?

“I have been working at a community health center.”

Are you married? Have kids?

“Yes, I am married to David, who some of you have met at our events! We have our first baby, a French Bulldog named ‘Winston’, who a lot of you love already! We have a new baby, Luan. He’s the best thing to happen to both of us (Winston’s still deciding if the crying is worth all the lack of sleep). We are exhausted; an exhausted no dental school all-nighter could compare to, but we’re so happy with him! We learn from him and grow with him daily.”

What do you enjoy doing outside of dentistry? - Family, Hobbies, Talents, volunteers, etc.

“I love to eat! That is one of my favorite things to do, especially with family and friends! One of my favorite cuisines is Vietnamese food, but I am biased. Vietnamese dishes often have all four elements of good food: salt, fat, acid, and heat (also a documentary on Netflix). Other than eating, when I had the time and energy before the baby. I love to read, write letters to

friends, journal, go on beach walks, explore farmers' markets all over San Diego, cooking and baking for friends, watching food shows/documentaries/competitions, and going to the gym.

What is one thing on your life bucket list that you have fulfilled and one thing yet to be fulfilled?

A11: "I went to Alinea, a 3 Michelin Star restaurant in Chicago. It was featured in a documentary, Spinning Plates, I was watching while studying. The head chef, Grant Achatz, had squamous cell carcinoma, mentioned right as I was reading about it in our PowerPoint, and he had a tongue and jaw resection with chemotherapy, so he couldn't taste his food, but somehow managed to get and maintain those 3 Michelin stars.

Bucket list to-do: more traveling! Particularly where Luan can learn about his roots: Vietnam, China, Germany, Poland, Cameroon, Congo, and Nigeria!"

Do you volunteer in dentistry? Are you involved in the dental society or other form of organized dentistry or dental missions?


