Oh, the Places You Will Go (and People You Will Meet Along the Way)

I write this month's editorial from the island of Corsica. After two and a half years of staying close to home, my family was finally able to leave the Western Hemisphere and ventured to Europe, connecting with some long since missed friends along the way.

Being able to travel was one of many motivational factors for me to pursue dentistry. I have memories of my dentist growing up, having to schedule any treatment I needed around his very full traveling schedule. An avid scuba diver, he often visited such places as the Bahamas, Aruba, or Bermuda. For this smalltown girl whose parents did not have a large income, and who had never left the state of California much less travel on an airplane (at least until the age of 17), this was greatly intriguing to me.

Over the years I certainly made up for lost time, made easier by a study abroad program I did in college. And with every trip I've taken, every country I've visited, every city I've stayed in, I find myself studying the people of the place. I observe their patterns of living, how they get to work, how they raise their children, the priorities they make in

living their lives. In each place I've visited, there has been a particular reason for the way its citizens live. And in almost every case outside of North America, they've been doing this for generations.

> What does my mentioning any of this have to do with dentistry?

It turns out, quite a lot!

Because at the heart of it, every person on this planet has a story. They are not a faceless mass who happens to live in X city in Y country. They are the summation of their specific experiences. And these are quite often vastly different from our own! I've visited third world countries where the poorest citizens, paradoxically despite their circumstances, live with a sense of purpose and contentment unrivaled in many western countries. Less can be more.


I say all of this to remind you, dear reader, that this is an invaluable perspective to have when we treat our patients, work with our staff, interact with our colleagues. The people with whom we surround ourselves have had different experiences than us. They may have grown up in different cities, states, countries, and quite often, even if within the same city, were exposed to different socioeconomic statuses.

When I was still practicing, one of my favorite parts of my job was to sit with my patients, if even for a minute, just to catch up, find out where they were on their path that day, to make sure they were fully onboard with what was going to happen in the chair. (Some days this was easier to do than others!) But ultimately, it was checking in with their story, their path, and to make sure that what we were going to do fit in. The vast majority of the time it did, but in doing this, I learned more about them and was able to better guide them in any further treatment they needed.

Traveling has greatly enhanced my sense of privilege in being able to experience something beyond my current circumstances. In a way I am grateful for my dentist growing up, for showing me that there was a place beyond my small-town life in California's Central Valley. But ultimately, it made me a much better dentist, and that was invaluable.

LET ME INTRODUCE..

Dr. Eric Shapira







lecturing to up to 300 people



I met Dr. Shapira while serving on the San Diego County Dental Society's Editorial Board. It would be an understatement to say this man is very interesting. He is beyond that and so much more. A husband, father, artist, dentist, educator, humanitarian and beyond. This is the first interview where I cried because I was so touched by his story and excellence for life. Hands-down he is one of the most intriguing and fascinating people I have met in my life and had the opportunity to interview. Our conversation was so rich and cannot possibly be contained in this article. I couldn't agree more with his statement, during our interview, "The people we meet and the people we treat is for them as much as it is for us." I ended our interview encouraged and challenged. I hope you will be too. Thus, I am pleased to share with you what I learned about our colleague Eric, the difference maker!

So, tell us a little about yourself. Where are you from originally? Where did you grow up?

From Mom and Dad. (Laughs). I was born in Los Angeles and lived there until I was 3 years old, then we moved to the San Fernando Valley. I left home at 17 and went to West Virginia for college.

Are you from a big, mediumsized, or small family?

I have a brother and sister. I am the oldest. So small but large in the sense that my mother was an only child and my father had 11 brother and sisters and he was the youngest son. His father, my grandfather, passed away at 87 years of age when my father was 12 years old. I lost my mother last year at the age of 97. My father's mother lived to be 100 years old and my mother's mother also lived to be 100 years old. My father died at age 62. The BRACA gene is heavy in my family. There is a high propensity for cancer with this gene and it took the life of over 23 people in my family.

What was one of your favorite childhood memories or activities?

Riding the ponies every weekend. I had

a cowboy hat with lacing on the brim, a cowboy shirt, and little boots. Going to the beach, just swimming and hanging out. I had a piano at 3 years old and my first classical piano recital was at age 4 or 5. I also played rag time and jazz as I got older. My dad put pressure on me to study something other than music. I was also a tap dancer; having danced on the stage at the Hollywood Music Box Theater. I missed making a movie by 1 day, The Eddie Cantor Story. I also did ballroom dancing, enjoyed painting while I was a kid; but in college, I learned how to do ceramics. I have been sculpting for over 50 years. I use bronze, marble, wood, acrylic, obsidian glass and clay all one-of-a-kind sculptures for the most part. I had my art in a gallery but there is no money to be made on the sculptures. The galleries don't want the paintings because there are "too many painters." I have shown my work in several museums as well.

Where did you complete your undergraduate studies? What did you major in?

West Virginia - Bethany College. Four United States presidents went there. I majored in chemistry and biology and minored in theatre. I was the first person in my immediate family to graduate college.

What was your "aha" coming to dentistry moment? How did you choose this fine profession?

In college I thought about medicine. My parents pushed it, but I got frustrated with the process. I was put on waitlists. In college, I met a guy who wanted to be a dentist and he went back to college to get some extra courses to do it. I had a couple of car wrecks and that is how I ended up sculpting. There was an art studio for women, Every Woman's Village, so I learned sculpture there, mostly clay. I wanted to know more about sculpture as I was very tactile. A guy who built movie sets started an art studio. My teacher showed me specialty tools and how to

make sculptures my own, like making hair and doing angles. I worked my way through college and one of my jobs was to sort nuts, bolts, and screws in a construction company. I could do it without looking after a while, as I could feel the article and know the size and where it belonged. I developed a good tactile sense. After learning how to sculpt, and my continued propensity towards medicine, I decided to go to dental school.

Where did you attend dental school? What year did you graduate? Did you complete a residency? I graduated dental school in 1975 from

Temple in Philadelphia. During my last vear of dental school, I worked on the Island of Sardinia at a dental clinic for 1 year. I gave a paper in Amsterdam as a student dentist for an International Symposium. It was my first lecture, but certainly not the last. I was able to attend this conference because I had finished my requirements early. I was also teaching in the Periodontics Department at Temple Dental School. All the departments wanted me to specialize. I went to medical school at the University of Pittsburg for 2 years and earned a master's degree in Biochemistry. I also attended USC School of Pharmacy where I earned master's credits in Nuclear Medicine and Radio Pharmacy. I completed a residency GPR in medicine and dentistry at Mt. Zion Hospital in San Francisco. It had a medical internship, so we made rounds in all the departments. I also hold a Certificate in Clinical Hypnosis, and an Oral Conscious Sedation permit.

What do you love most about dentistry?

It is both the art and science gateway to people's overall health and longevity and I am happy to contribute to that. I enjoy working with people, changing lives, and increasing their happiness. and lifespans. I learned a lot about myself through helping others.


Do you own your own practice?

I had my own practice for over 30 years. I had 12 employees, 2 hygienists, my wife ran the practice. We also had an

insurance specialist, front office appointment specialist and students, as part-time associates. I sold it due to a neck injury and surgery in 2004. I was in rehab for 2 years and that's when I wrote the book A New Wrinkle. I have worked as an associate part-time in other practices. I have also taught at different institutions. I used to teach at UCSF in the TMJ Clinic and at UOP for 4-5 years as an associate clinical professor focused on medically compromised patients, geriatrics, and special needs patients. I would take senior students to the Laguna Honda Hospital, a chronic care facility in San Francisco. I wanted to make sure these students knew about these "special needs and compromised patients." Many were ambulatory adults, and some were bedridden. When we were in dental school, we didn't have special needs patients. I was exposed to brain damaged people at a special need's facility. I was scared at first, but I knew I had to challenge myself. I have enjoyed teaching Implantology and have placed implants for years.

I also worked in China as a foreign expert in dentistry and medicine. They paid my way but I received no salary. They have 600,000 foreign experts in China from all around the world. I taught dentistry, nursing, geriatric dentistry and medicine and dental palliative care, hospital administration. I assisted the hospital in designing a new geriatric hospital. In early 2008, while in China, my wife wanted to give blood after a terrible earthquake. I found the Blood Mobile staff not wearing gloves or maintaining sterile conditions. We gave money for aid and not our blood. It took me 4 years of teaching there to stop the doctors from smoking in the hospital. I was teaching on aging and oral systemic disease, as well as many other topics. From 2007-2017 I worked in China. In 2014 I was honored and presented with the countries Friendship Award, which is the highest humanitarian award given in China. There were 6000 people nominated and I was the only doctor out of six awardees. The government gave speeches, there was music and singing.

Are you married? Do you have kids?

Yes. My wife's name is Susan. We celebrated our 43rd anniversary this year and have known each other for 45 years. She majored in geography and worked for a cartographer in San Francisco. She was a director at a senior center when we met and asked if I could give a talk to her seniors at the center. So, I gave a talk on oral cancer to the seniors. A few weeks later I saw her on a tennis court and the third time I ran into her she asked me if I liked horses. Yes! So, for our first date we went riding on the beach!! Romantic, I have to say. We have a son who went to art school and has a plumbing business, he lives in Half-moon Bay. We have twin daughters, one in Grass Valley and the other is in Susanville, CA. We have 6 grandkids and 4 great-grandchildren. Both of my daughters worked in my office at the age of 15 and both became RDAs. My granddaughter is an RDAEF and lives near Lake Tahoe.

What do you enjoy doing outside of dentistry?

- Family, Hobbies, Talents, etc. I know you are a writer.

I like to cook. I like to grow veggies. I planted an olive orchard at my house, and I had 8 quarts last year. I had to throw away about 1/3 of my crop due to pests. We get snakes, rosy boas, gopher snakes, white banded king snakes, rattlesnakes, and coachwhip snakes. The coachwhip tried to bite me twice, but they are not poisonous. I don't want to kill them.

I am a musician, artist, writer, and teacher. I am an Aging Specialist and I wrote a book on aging, A New Wrinkle: What I learned from Older People Who Never Acted Their Age. It is in its 2nd edition. At the present, "even if I can't do much, I can do something." I had neck surgery and was in a collar for 9 months a year ago and I couldn't sleep, so I wrote a textbook on geriatric dentistry and medicine. I teach a master track course on aging and dentistry with the Academy of General Dentistry. I love teaching and have been an advisor and mentor.

What is one thing on your life bucket list that you have yet to fulfill?

I am in the process of writing 3 more books right now. I would like to travel more and spend time with our family.

Do you volunteer in dentistry? Are you involved in the dental society or other forms of organized dentistry or dental missions? I know you are on the Editorial Board with the Dental Society.

I have done a lot of service around the world. China, (where I always had a translator and a bodyguard), all throughout S. America, Chile, Sri Lanka, (where I brought 40 water purification systems, latrines and water filtration), Ecuador, Mexico, (where I was a part of providing 250 wheelchairs), and Bolivia (where I have performed Cleft lip and palate surgeries). I have done most all of this on my own dime. This is the price we pay for the space we occupy. I have done dentistry in Jamaica, (in the jungle with no electricity and you can imagine how hard it is to work while the chair is stuck in one position). One time customs had confiscated all my stuff, yet I still managed to be of assistance. Also, I have been a Rotarian for over 47 years, the Rotary Club has been a great help, and we gather donations and send them to countries.

How many languages do you speak? I have to ask with all the traveling you have done.

I speak a few languages. English, Spanish, some Mandarin, German, some French, Italian, Hebrew.

Do people ever tell you that you look like someone famous?

Some people say I look like Howie Mandel or Billie Crystal. I don't see the resemblance. My brother looks spot on like Anthony Bourdain. People have asked him for his autograph and he does it!

Do you have a life quote?

"We don't know what gifts we have until we give them away." This is my own quote that I came up with. Dentistry changes lives. Be a frog, they can only go

forward. If a frog wants to go backward, they have to turn around and then they are going forward again."


